

SIX BOYS AND IWO JIMA

My Dad, a B-29 pilot, 23yrs old, had to make an emergency landing on lwo Jima due to having one of his engines shot up and on fire barely two weeks after the battle and the island still had not yet been secured from pockets of resistance. (My Mother had a nightmare about it at the EXACT SAME TIME!). Bomber pilots were especially despised by the Japanese and had the resistance spotted my Dad and his



crew...they would have been slaughtered, plus there would have been two less Priests in the world--his navigator, the future Fr. Tom Maney and me

Each year I am hired to go to Washington, DC, with the eighth grade class from Clinton, WI where I grew up, to videotape their trip. I greatly enjoy visiting our nation's capital, and each year I take some special memories back with me. This fall's trip was especially memorable. ??

On the last night of our trip, we were at the Iwo Jima memorial. This memorial is the largest bronze statue in the world and depicts one of the most famous photographs in history -- that of the six brave soldiers raising the American Flag at the top of a rocky hill on the island of Iwo Jima, Japan, during WW II. Over one hundred students and chaperones piled off the buses and headed towards the memorial. I noticed a solitary figure at the base of the statue, and as I got closer he asked, 'Where are you guys from?'

I told him that we were from Wisconsin. 'Hey, I'm a cheese head, too! Come gather around, Cheese heads, and I will tell you a story.'

It was James Bradley who just happened to be in Washington, DC, to speak at the memorial the following day. He was there that night to say good night to his dad, who had passed away. He was just about to leave when he saw the buses pull up. I videotaped him as he spoke to us, and received his permission to share what he said from my videotape. It is one thing to tour the incredible monuments filled with history in Washington, DC, but it is quite another to get the kind of insight we received that night.

When all had gathered around, he reverently began to speak. (Here are his words that night.) 'My name is James Bradley and I'm from Antigo, Wisconsin My dad is on that statue, and I wrote a book called 'Flags of Our Fathers'. It is the story of the six boys you see behind me.

'Six boys raised the flag. The first guy putting the pole in the ground is Harlon Block. Harlon was an all-state football player. He enlisted in the Marine Corps with all the senior members of his football team. They were off to play another type of game. A game called 'War.' But it didn't turn out to be a game. Harlon, at the age of 21, died with his intestines in his hands. I don't say that to gross you out, I say that because there are people who stand in front of this statue and talk about the glory of war. You guys need to know that most of the boys in Iwo Jima were 17, 18, and 19 years old - and it was so hard that the ones who did make it home never even would talk to their families about it (He pointed to the statue) 'You see this next guy? That's Rene Gagnon from New Hampshire If you took Rene's helmet off at the moment this photo was taken and looked in the webbing of that helmet, you would find a photograph...a photograph of his girlfriend Rene put that in there for protection because he was scared. He was 18 years old It was just boys who won the battle of Iwo Jima. Boys. Not old men. 'The next guy here, the third guy in this tableau, was Sergeant Mike Strank. Mike is my hero. He was the hero of all these guys. They called him the 'old man' because he was so old. He was already 24. When Mike would motivate his boys in training camp, he didn't say, 'Let's go kill some Japanese' or 'Let's die for our country' He knew he was talking to little boys. Instead he would say, 'You do what I say, and I'll get you home to your mothers.' 'The last guy on this side of the statue is Ira Hayes, a Pima Indian from Arizona. Ira Hayes was one of them who lived to walk off Iwo Jima . He went into the White House with my dad. President Truman told him, 'You're a hero' He told reporters, 'How can I feel like a hero when 250 of my buddies hit the island with me and only 27 of us walked off alive?' So you take your class at school, 250 of you spending a year together having fun, doing everything together. Then all 250 of you hit the beach, but only 27 of your classmates walk off alive. That was Ira Hayes. He had images of horror in his mind. Ira Hayes carried the pain home with him and eventually died dead drunk, face down, drowned in a very shallow puddle, at the age of 32 (ten years after this picture was taken).

'The next guy, going around the statue, is Franklin Sousley from Hilltop, Kentucky. A fun-lovin' hillbilly boy. His best friend, who is now 70, told me, 'Yeah, you know, we took two cows up on the porch of the Hilltop General Store. Then we strung wire across the stairs so the cows couldn't get down. Then we fed them Epsom salts. Those cows crapped all night.' Yes, he was a fun-lovin' hillbilly boy. Franklin died on Iwo Jima at the age of 19. When the telegram came to tell his mother that he was dead, it went to the Hilltop General Store. A barefoot boy ran that telegram up to his mother's farm. . The neighbors could hear her scream all night and into the morning. Those neighbors lived a quarter of a mile away.

'The next guy, as we continue to go around the statue, is my dad, John Bradley, from Antigo, Wisconsin, where I was raised. My dad lived until 1994, but he would never give interviews. When Walter Cronkite's producers or the New York Times would call, we were trained as little kids to say 'No, I'm sorry, sir, my dad's not here. He is in Canada fishing. No, there is no phone there, sir. No, we don't know when he is coming back.' My dad never fished or even went to Canada. Usually, he was sitting there right at the table eating his Campbell's soup. But we had to tell the press that he was out fishing. He didn't want to talk to the press ?? ?? 'You see, like Ira Hayes, my dad didn't see himself as a hero. Everyone thinks these guys are heroes, cause they are in a photo and on a monument. My dad knew better. He was a medic. John Bradley from Wisconsin was a combat caregiver. On Iwo Jima he probably held over 200 boys as they died. And when boys died on Iwo Jima, they writhed and screamed, without any medication or help with the pain. 'When I was a little boy, my third grade teacher told me that my dad was a hero. When I went home and told my dad that, he looked at me and said, 'I want you always to remember that the heroes of Iwo Jima are the guys who did not come back. Did NOT come back.'

'So that's the story about six nice young boys. Three died on Iwo Jima, and three came back as national heroes. Overall, 7,000 boys died on Iwo Jima in the worst battle in the history of the Marine Corps. My voice is giving out, so I will end here. Thank you for your time.'

Suddenly, the monument wasn't just a big old piece of metal with a flag sticking out of the top. It came to life before our eyes with the heartfelt words of a son who did indeed have a father who was a hero. Maybe not a hero for the reasons most people would believe, but a hero nonetheless. One thing I learned while on tour with my 8th grade students in DC that is not mentioned here is . . that if you look at the statue very closely and count the number of

'hands' raising the flag, there are 13. When the man who made the statue was asked why there were 13, he simply said the 13th hand was the hand of God.?? ??

Great story - worth your time - worth every American's time. Please pass it on





Adjutant's Report for June

You will be receiving your 2020 dues notices from National soon, they will have the incorrect mailing address on them as they were printed before our address change. Please note the new mailing address,



620 N Rock Road Ste 230-316, Derby KS 37037, the Post Office will forward mail for the next 90 days but it would be best to start using the mew address just to be sure we get your renewal or any other correspondence. Remember we will be starting the new Legion year (2019-2020) July 1st, 2020 dues will be due starting July 1st. I know that the year beginning July 1st is confusing to most of us since we did not join in July but the American Legion is on a fiscal year (July 1 – June 30) not calendar year. Please pay your dues as soon as possible and help us reach 100% next year. Just a reminder that if you have not renewed your membership for 2019 National has placed you in inactive status, all benefits are expired. We ended the 2018 year with 323 total renewed, transferred and new members, 33 short of our goal of 356 set by Department. We are behind our goal this year with only 303 renewals and new members, (we picked up 7new members,) with only 1 months to go in this Legion year we are behind 53 members. You can mail your dues to the post or pay online at <u>www.legion.org</u>/renew, we are only at 85.11%, if you are a Kansas Life member and have not renewed your membership please remember there was a change in your membership a couple of years ago requiring KLMs to pay \$18.50 per year to keep their membership current, if you have any questions call me at 681-3181 or Bryan Page at 259-1838. You cannot renew on line if you are a Kansas Life Member, you must renew through the post.

Remember memberships not renewed by the end of December were placed in inactive status by National and your Legion benefits were suspended.

Remember the new Legion year starts July 1, 2019 and ends June 30, 2020.

You can take the official American Legion Basic Training course by going to <u>www.legion.org/alei</u>. The course is free, but there is a small fee to get your pin, you will learn History & Organization, Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation, National Security, Americanism, Children and Youth and course conclusion explaining how all the pieces of the American Legion fit together to best serve our veterans and country. I have taken the course twice and highly recommend it to everyone, we have several members that have taken the course, one has taken it several times, and they felt the course was well worth taking, it only takes 2 to 4 hours, you can leave the course at any time and return to it later, you do not have to complete it all at once.

There have been discussions of having several flag retirements, one in Haysville and one in Derby. If you have never attended a flag retirement ceremony you should come to one of these, when the dates are confirmed we will send out the information.

Remember the new National Veterans Memorial and Museum is now open in Columbus Ohio. The 53,000 square-foot museum allows visitors to trace the service and sacrifice of U.S. veterans from the Revolutionary War through the war on terrorism through the words of the veterans themselves. You can learn more about this museum at <u>www.nationalvmm.org</u>.

The state convention was be held May 17, 18, 19, 2019 at the Atrium Hotel 1400 N Lorraine in Hutchinson.

The American Legion Leadership College was held May 31, June 1,2, 2019 at Cloud County Community College.

District V is still in 4th place in the Department membership standings as of May 31st.

The Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency (DPAA) announced that the remains of 18 U.S. servicemen, missing from the WWII and or Korean War have been identified and will be returned to their families for burial with full military honors.

More than 82,000 Americans remain missing from WWII, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, the Cold War, and the Gulf Wars/other conflicts. Out of the 82,000 missing, 75% of the losses are located in the Indo-Pacific, and over 41,000 of the missing are presumed lost at sea (i.e. ship losses, known aircraft water losses, etc.). The Defense POW/ MIA Accounting Agency's mission is to provide the fullest possible accounting for our missing personnel from past conflicts to their families and the nation.




